He is a co-author of the main publications of LEDBL project including *A Grammar of Baram* (2011), *A Baram-Nepali-English Dictionary* (2011), *An Ethnographic Sketch of the Baram People* (2010, in Nepali) published by Central Department of Linguistics and LEDBL Project. He is also the author of *Darai Grammar* (2012) published by Lincom Europa, Munchen.



Mr. Dhakal has worked on Indo-Aryan and Tibeto-Burman languages spoken in Nepal.
